WRITERS GUILDS ANNOUNCE CALL FOR SUBMISSIONS FOR 2014 WGA DOCUMENTARY SCREENPLAY AWARD

Los Angeles and New York – The Writers Guild of America, West (WGAW) and Writers Guild of America, East (WGAE) today announced that submissions are now open for the 2014 WGA Documentary Screenplay Award, honoring outstanding achievement in documentary feature writing. This year marks the addition of a new eligibility requirement for the award: theatrical documentaries must be produced under the jurisdiction of the WGA or an affiliate Guild to be eligible for consideration.

Submissions for the WGA's doc writing award may be received from <u>August 19 through</u> <u>November 15, 2013</u>.

WGA Documentary Screenplay nominees, as well as Original and Adapted Screenplay nominees, will be announced on Friday, January 3, 2014. The WGA Documentary Screenplay Award will be presented – along with other film, TV, new media, radio, news, and videogame award categories – at the 2014 Writers Guild Awards to be held on Saturday, February 1, 2014, at simultaneous ceremonies in Los Angeles and New York City.

First presented in 2005, the WGA Documentary Screenplay Award was established to spotlight the writer's primary role in documentary filmmaking's creative process, recognize the fact that the majority of non-fiction feature films are written, and spotlight the benefits of working under a Writers Guild contract.

Qualifications for WGA Documentary Screenplay Award eligibility include:

- Theatrical documentaries must have been written under the WGA's MBA or under a bona fide collective bargaining agreement of the Writers Guild of Canada, Writers Guild of Great Britain, Irish Playwrights & Screenwriters Guild, New Zealand Writers Guild, La Guilde Francaise des Scénaristes (France), Scriptwriters Guild of Israel, or the Société des Auteurs de Radio, Télévision et Cinéma (Quebec), i.e., "affiliate Guilds."
- Documentaries must contain an on-screen writing credit and have been exhibited theatrically in Los Angeles or New York for at least one week during 2013.
- The deadline for submissions is 5:30 p.m. (PST), Friday, November 15, 2013.
- Scripts must be feature length (more than 40 minutes).
- Documentaries that received their first public exhibition via broadcast or cable television are not eligible for WGA awards consideration.
- Foreign-language films are eligible, provided they feature English-language subtitles.
